The Seventh Sunday of Easter

Here are some activities you could do together as a family, begin with the story and then do as many or as few as you like, in any order.

### Discussion

<u>A question for adults to ask children</u> Who do you think Jesus was praying for?

Jesus knew that he would be returning to heaven and commissioning his followers to continue the work he had begun on the earth. Jesus knew that his death on the cross had made a way for everybody in the world to come into relationship with God through. The task ahead was to share that Good News with everybody in the world, Jesus' prayer was for all those who would carry the news to others.

Jesus knew it would be difficult for his followers, that they would be rejected and even attacked by some people. In verse 20 Jesus also prays for those who will hear and respond to the message in the future, that includes us thousands of years after Jesus was on the earth!

<u>A question for children to ask adults</u> Can you think of a time when you shared your faith with somebody else? How did they respond?

## Family Activity 1

"They don't belong to the world, just as I don't belong to the world."

Jesus knew that his disciples were in the world but not 'of' the world, they were children of God called to live differently and promised eternity with Him.

Play a 'what doesn't belong here' game. Pick a room in the house, everybody closes their eyes while one person goes and collects an object from another room and brings it in. Once the object is hidden in plain sight everybody should open their eyes. Who can be the first person to spot the item that doesn't belong in the room!

Bible Passage

Today we will be exploring together, Jesus' prayer for us.

Read the story together – choose a Bible translation or children's story version which best suits your group.

### A verse to remember

#### John 17 v 3 "And this is eternal life: that people know you, the only true God, and that they know Jesus Christ, the One you sent."

These words were spoken by Jesus – because of his sacrifice on the cross everybody who accepted him as their Saviour would be able to know God the father as he did – as a close friend and as a loving father.

Try to learn this verse together, you could come up with some actions to help you remember it . Why not decorate the verse on a piece of paper or card together and put it up somewhere to remind you of it through the week?


# Active Prayer

### Family Activity 2

### Helping Older Children

The idea of sharing our faith with others can be intimidating for children particularly the reactions of peers. Encourage them that just like Jesus we can share God's love through the way we live and treat others. We can choose to behave in a way that pleases God which may make us appear different and unusual in the world.



Even if we are not confident in speaking about our faith with others we can pray and ask God to use our everyday words and actions to show and share His love with those we meet.
